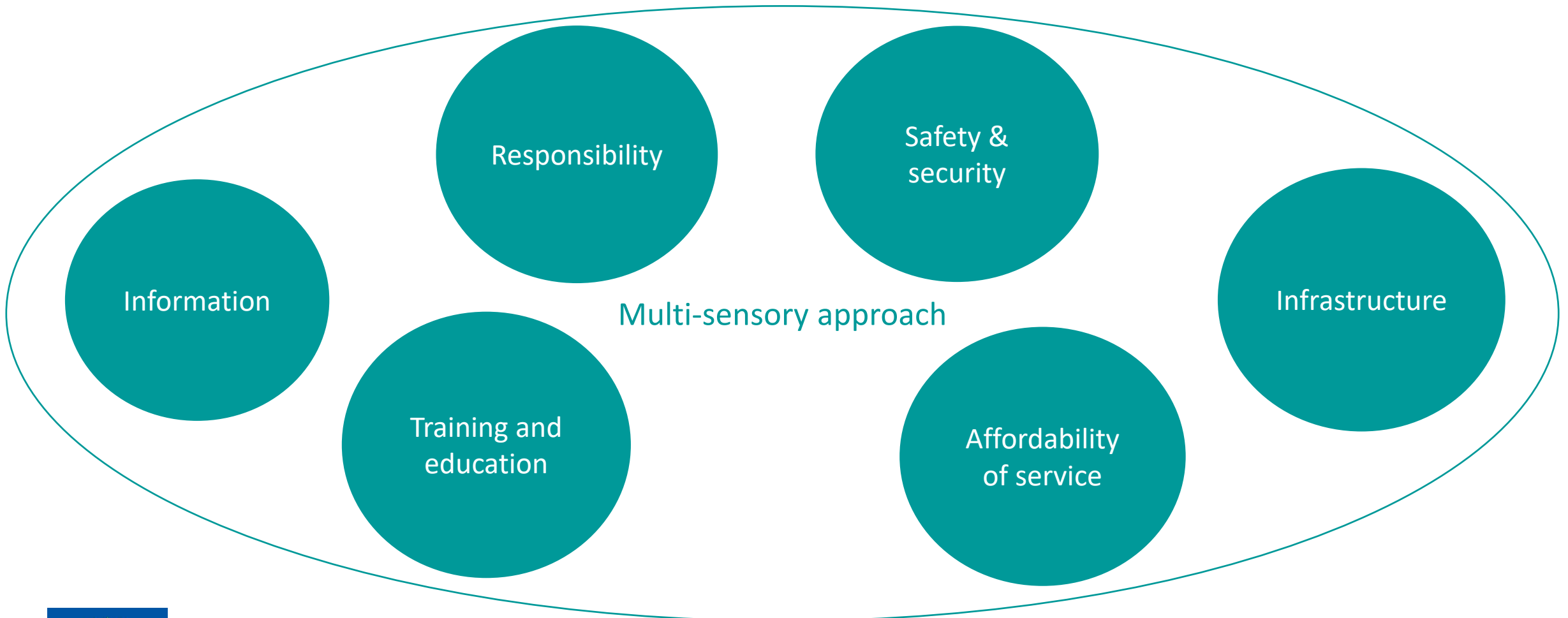


# Policy Recommendations

- Addressing: policymakers as well as mobility service providers, transport planners and city planners.
- Give guidance on how to implement automated mobility services in an inclusive way
- *Derived from:*
  - D2.1 Results of the literature review and desk research
  - D2.2 Catalogue of needs and requirements, report on statistical data analysis results
  - D2.4 Conceptual Design of the Serious Game

# Recommendations on co-creation methods in the development process of inclusive automated mobility solutions

- **Support a culture of participation and co-creation in your country, organisation or team**  
diverse stakeholders and (potential) users need to be continuously involved in planning and development procedures
- **“Nothing for and about us, without us!”**  
Policy makers, decision makers and planners should always demand the inclusion and participation of the persons who will be affected by an automated mobility services. This can prevent frustration, planning past people's needs and (costly) re-building afterwards.
- **Work with a diverse group of persons with knowledge of the area**  
involve locals in you're the development and decision process who represent the diversity of the area under consideration



# Recommendations on co-creation methods in the development process of inclusive automated mobility solutions

- **The setting for participatory processes must be inclusive and accessible**  
the setting and modes for conducting participatory and co-creation processes needs to be inclusive and accessible. Make sure to adapt your participatory processes and co-design methods to the requirements of your target groups.
- **Take the inputs of the users serious**  
The integration of the results of participation and co-design processes into development and decision procedures should be binding and can be reached by obtaining commitment from decision makers in advance.



# Policy recommendations on research & innovation

- **Make research and innovation more diverse!**  
Create funding landscape and supportive legal framework conditions that not only encourage the inclusion of diversity aspects (gender, class, culture, etc.) but make it a priority --> starting from a funding call written in an easy language, to the involvement of different user-groups in testing
- **Create legal framework for inclusive testing**  
e.g. wheelchair use-case in Austria
